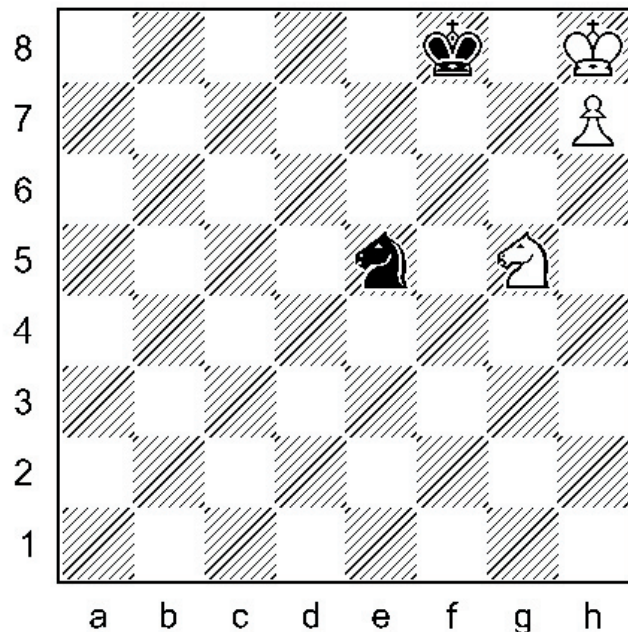

<p><b>Chess Solution</b></p> <p>One of the ways to draw a chess game is by perpetual check, which means issuing the same sequence of checks forever. In this case, White draws the game by 1. Ne6+ Kf7 2. Ng5+ Kf8 3. Ne6+ Kf7 4. Ng5+ Kf8, and so on. If the Black king moves away from the squares f7 and f8, White wins. For example, 1. Ne6+ Ke7 2. Kg7 Nf7 3. Nf8 Ke8 4. Ng6 Nh8 5. Nxh8.</p>
